

J. Richard House is a Principal of PCA Partners, LLC (“PCA”). PCA is a financial advisory firm that provides pension-focused corporate finance, risk management and restructuring advisory services to pension plan sponsors and financial intermediaries as well as investors pursuing mergers and acquisitions involving defined benefit pension plans.

Previously, Mr. House worked at the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (“PBGC”), the federal corporation that guarantees payment of basic pension benefits earned by 44 million American workers and retirees participating in over 27,500 private-sector defined benefit pension plans. From 2008 to 2010, he was the head of the corporate finance and restructuring group (known as the Department of Insurance Supervision and Compliance) at PBGC.

As head of corporate finance & restructuring, he led a group of financial analysts, actuaries and attorneys on all matters relating to risks to the federal pension insurance program posed by distressed companies and/or companies with significantly underfunded pension plans. I oversaw the group’s monitoring and management of risk through institutional tracking of the largest pension exposures, as well as the department’s handling of hundreds of Chapter 11 and Chapter 7 cases and M&A corporate transactions, assessing the likelihood of insurable events and pursuing strategies for maximizing creditor recoveries on behalf of PBGC where warranted.

While at PBGC, Mr. House was integrally involved in several of the most prominent industrial, manufacturing and transportation restructurings of the past decade, including United Airlines, US Airways, Northwest Airlines, Delta Airlines, Delphi Auto Parts, General Motors and Chrysler.

Mr. House has over 25 years of experience as a lawyer and advocate in the areas of employee benefits, labor and corporate reorganizations. Before joining PBGC in 2002, he represented single and multiemployer pension and retiree health care plans, and the companies that sponsored such plans, as a private-practice attorney with Washington D.C. law firms.
